#### Participate in Glockenspiel Performances at Strassenfest

There are 9 scheduled Glockenspiel performances: Thursday, Friday & Saturday at 7pm, 8pm and 9pm. The Glockenspiel performances can be viewed from both sides of the Glockenspiel.

The performance starts with asking German Club members to come on stage. This group will be the song leaders for an Ein Prosit at the conclusion of the children's performance. Wear your traditional German clothing or your German colors and let the crowd know how much fun it is to be a member of the German Club.

Since this is a participatory event, 3 members of the audience will be selected to participate in the Ein Prosit

chants at the end. The three chants are changed to be G-Rated and help to sell our food in the booth:

1. Zicke Zacke Zicke Zacke Hoy, Hoy, Hoy
2. Bratwurst, Schnitzel Ja, Ja, Ja
3. Apfel Strudel, Cream Puff Yum, Yum, Yum
4. Das Strassenfest is Wunderbar Prost

NOTE: The First Official Glockenspiel Performance at Strassenfest will feature Danny Wehr and Dave Buehler doing the chants. They just need to remember to use the G-Rated version.

At the top of the hour, children will exit the doors and ring the bells, 7 times for 7 o'clock.

The song "My Favorite Strassenfest Things" will be played. And the children will carry props associated with the lyrics.

The first stanza sings about Schnitzel, Kuchen, Strudel and cream puff. The children will carry signs with pictures of the food served at the German Club Booth.

The second stanza sings about Willkommen & Schuhplattler dancers, Lanterns and May Poles. The children will carry small lanterns and small May Poles.

The last stanza sings about Polkas, Waltzes and Chicken Dances. The children will do the chicken dance as they dance through the Glockenspiel.

When the Ein Prosit is sing by member of the German Club, the children will hold up signs so the crowd knows the chants to say.

#### Participate German Heritage Events at Strassenfest

All the German Heritage Events outside of the Beer Garden, will be moving to the Glockenspiel Stage. The stage will be on the south side of Glockenspiel in the Ace Fencing parking lot.

With the backdrop of the Glockenspiel, pictures of participant will be wunderbar for these Free German Events that follow the First Official Glockenspiel Performance:



1. Learn to Dance the Schuhplattler and Chicken Dance
2. Schnitzelbank Sing-along
3. Schokospiel – a Chocolate Game
4. Dad's Root Beer Mug holding Contest
5. Log Sawing

Start the evening by attending Opening Ceremonies. The German Heritage performances have been returned to Opening Ceremonies. We have 60 children who will perform in the Willkommen Dance, Kinderchor Hand Bell and German Song, May Pole Dance & Schuhplattler Dance. Also witness the lighting of the Sister City Lantern by Mayor Dean Vonderheide and Strassenfest Club Host & Hostess, Paul & Mary Leah Siegel.

The Parade to the Beer Garden will leave the Main Stage as members of the crowd take a small German Flag and join in the parade. The parade will stop at the Glockenspiel for the first Official Strassenfest Glockenspiel performance.

The Parade to the Beer Garden will then into the Beer Garden. Grab a beer for the Ceremonial Tapping of the first keg.

After the Ein Prosit is song, it is time for the First Official Waltz of the Strassenfest and the First Official Polka of the Strassenfest. Join in for the first dances. You don't have to be as good as the Prechtels, Jeffries or Leo & Henrietta. Just join in and fill the dance floor.

Following those dances, the Landler dance will be presented in the Beer Garden by members of the German Club.

### German Heritage Award Nomination

The Jasper DeutscherVerein, Jasper Partnership Commission, and Sister Cities of Jasper, Inc. will celebrate German-American Day on Thursday, October 6th, with a dinner at The Schnitzelbank. The dinner and program will honor the contributions made by German immigrants to the life and culture of the United States.

The annual German Heritage Award will be presented to an individual or group who has contributed generously his/her or their time, talents or resources to maintaining, improving or building upon the German roots in Dubois County. The recognition is open to all individuals who give what they can in order to make a difference.

A nomination will recognize the work of those who generously support our local German Heritage.

Nominations need to be sent to Jasper DeutscherVerein, German Heritage Award, P. O. Box 15, Jasper, IN 47547-0015 and should include a letter of up to one page listing the reason for the nomination, a biography, up to two pages, listing the service or efforts of the nominee along with the Nominee's Name, Home address and whether the nominee's service is voluntary or paid. The Nominator's name and address must also be included and must be postmarked by September 1, 2022.

Sister Cities of Jasper and the Jasper Partnership Commission created the award in 1999.

## Next Best Thing to Robert Redford Dessert

### INGREDIENTS

1 cup flour  
1/2 cup butter  
1 cup pecans, finely chopped  
1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened  
8 ounces whipped topping, thawed  
1 cup powdered sugar  
4 ounces instant chocolate pudding mix  
4 ounces vanilla instant pudding mix  
3 cups milk  
1 1/2 ounces milk chocolate candy bars, grated

### DIRECTIONS

For the crust, mix flour, butter and nuts until crumbly, press into 9x13 inch pan and bake at 350° for 20 minutes.

Cool Completely.

Beat cream cheese and powdered sugar on high with a mixer until smooth.

Fold in half the whipped topping.

Spread over cooled crust.

Mix the puddings with milk, beat slowly with mixer until smooth (2 minutes).

Spread on top of cheese layer.

Let stand a few minutes, then spoon remaining whipped topping over top and spread carefully.

Sprinkle with grated milk chocolate bar.

Cover and refrigerate until ready to serve.

## **What is a Bollenhut? That Iconic Black Forest Tracht Hat!**

One of the most iconic images for Germany's Black Forest is a fresh faced woman wearing a hat covered with red Pom Poms... a Bollenhut, but, what is a Bollenhut? This stiff straw hat covered in wool Pom Poms is an important part of Tracht. But it's not as "common" as advertising and media would have us think. Although, the Bollenhut has come to be a symbol for the Black Forest, it is traditionally worn in only 3 communities, Gutach, Kirnbach und Reichenbach in the Kinzig Valley. And it's only been around for just over 200 years!

The first mention of a Bollenhut was at the beginning of the 1800s. Before this, the small enclave of Protestant women in the Kinzig Valley of the Black Forest would wear modest black caps after marriage. In neighboring communities, the Catholic women would wear golden crown-like hats decorated with pearls, gems and beautiful embroidery.

In 1797, Duke Friedrich Eugen von Wuerttemberg saw hat production as a way to help boost the economy of the Black Forest. When straw weaving hats for women became more common and affordable, the Protestant women made a switch. Originally, the circles were painted on, and then by 1820, a few small pom poms were added to the hats to make them more festive... and then more... and then they got bigger! Until they arrived at the traditional number of 14 Pom Poms.

Girls receive their first Bollenhut at their Confirmation. This one has red Pom Poms, and represents "availability". When a woman marries, she trades the red in for a more modest black. The hat is worn over a cap that covers the hair (before confirmation, girls just wear the cap).

Like most traditional Tracht, there are strict rules or guidelines to wearing a Bollenhut.

It's only worn for festival days or church days. It is NEVER worn with jeans and t-shirts... only with the matching Tracht. Matching Tracht means the Black Forest embroidered dress and white blouse with GIANT sleeves. Not that cute blue Dirndl you found in a shop in Munich. And it's NEVER EVER worn as a Karneval Costume
