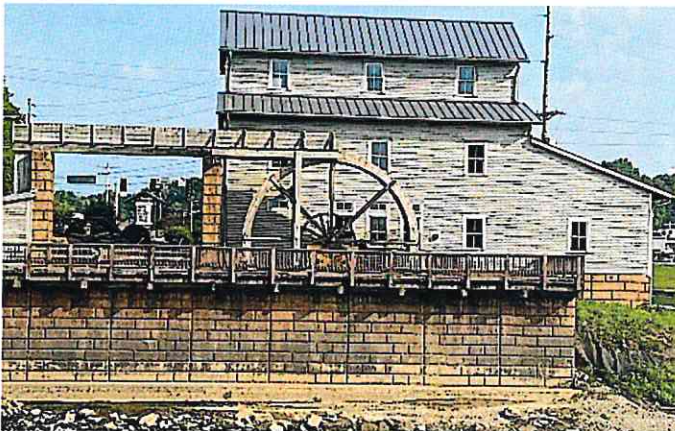

A message from our vice president

Thanks to everyone who attending the May German Club meeting and shared their thoughts about the future of the German Club. Members were moved from their "I always sit here" spots and placed a different tables. This allowed people to get to know new people and hear other's opinions about the Club.

1. Everyone received a listing of functions, events or activities that the German Club is currently doing. The each person marked each item to indicate if it should continue or if it has outlived its usefulness.
2. Each table created a list of ideas that might be fun or important to add to the current list of activities.

It was very interesting to hear the feedback at the meeting and to hear all the conversations that happened after the meeting was over. Was great to see all the synergy in the room and opinions being shared in open conversations.

After much typing, the Officers have received the information. President Landen Weidenbenner and Vice President Laura Grammer will review the Officer's feedback and create a plan to present to the Board.

One of the suggestions is being implemented now. There was overwhelming support to have different people involved in carrying something in the Parade to the Beer Garden. Mix it up, let other people get involved. So this year we have 26 German Club Members carrying something in the Parade to the Beer Garden.

Put on your German Clothing and plan to attend the Opening Ceremonies on Thursday night to support the 60 Students that have been practicing all year to be part of German Heritage Events at Opening Ceremonies. Then join in the Parade to the Beer Garden. This is the plan for the event:

The lead people in the parade will be carrying a Jasper German Club Banner.

German Club President, Landen Weidenbenner, will carry the German Flag and Brandon Ferguson, will carry the American Flag.

The next row has the 2 German Exchange Students that will be attending Jasper High School in the fall, Linda Mayer & Felix Eckerle. They will be flanked on one side by Lukas Mahler, Pfaffenweiler Mayor, carrying a Pfaffenweiler flag, and on the other side by Jasper Mayor Dean Vonderheide carrying the City of Jasper Flag.

Following next is music provided by Mark Messmer on Trumpet and Dana Knies Welp on Accordion.

This year the German Club is carrying the 16 State flags of Germany that contain each German State's Crest. These flags will run the entire length of the parade.

The Keg & Bratwurst carriers will be placed between the flags of the German States.

The parade will start immediately following Opening Ceremonies. Then stop at the Glockenspiel for the First Performance of the year. Then on the Beer Garden for the Ceremonial Tapping of the Keg, and the singing of the Ein Prosit.

Following that will be the First Waltz and then the First Polka and then the Ländler Dance.

If you have ever wanted to learn to dance the Waltz, Polka or Ländler, there will be a class on July 13th at 6:30pm at Ackerman Oil Shop/Warehouse. Bring your drinks and a chair. Some NON-PROFESSIONAL people will be teaching the dances.

Don't worry if you can't dance and don't expect to leave being able to compete in a Ball Room Dancing Competition. The goal is to get everyone ready to have fun and participate in the First Waltz, First Polka and the Ländler Dance at Strassenfest.

All of the wonderful things the Strassenfest does would not be possible without the income from the Strassenfest Booth. Please sign up for at least one shift. And join us for Setup on Monday July 31st from 5pm until done. AND for Teardown on Sunday, August 6th after the Parade.

German Heritage Award Nomination

The Jasper DeutscherVerein, Jasper Partnership Commission, and Sister Cities of Jasper, Inc. will celebrate German-American Day in October at KlubHaus 61 with an Oktoberfest themed dinner with drinks and dancing. In addition, there will be the High School Essay Contest Awards and Band/Entertainment. The event will honor the contributions made by German immigrants to the life and culture of the United States.

The annual German Heritage Award will be presented to an individual or group who has contributed generously his/her or their time, talents or resources to maintaining, improving or building upon the German roots in Dubois County. The recognition is open to all individuals who give what they can in order to make a difference.

A nomination will recognize the work of those who generously support our local German Heritage.

Nominations need to be sent to Jasper DeutscherVerein, German Heritage Award, P. O. Box 15, Jasper, IN 47547-0015 and should include a letter of up to one page listing the reason for the nomination, a biography, up to two pages, listing the service or efforts of the nominee along with the Nominee's Name, Home address and whether the nominee's service is voluntary or paid. The Nominator's name and address must also be included and must be postmarked by September 1, 2023.

Sister Cities of Jasper and the Jasper Partnership Commission created the award in 1999.

The Jasper DeutscherVerein is sponsoring the award.

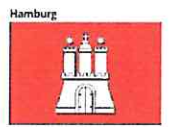
