## **25 Anniversary Trip Planned**

The Jasper Partnership Commission along with Sister Cities of Jasper are organizing a Sister City Visit with coach tour through France and Switzerland this coming June. Departure from Jasper will be on June 16<sup>th</sup>.

We will celebrate our 25th Anniversary of our Partnership in the Snail Valley with a busy schedule for the next three days with the Pfaffenweiler community, your host family, including on Sunday the Steibickfescht (Stone Quarry Festival) in the historical quarry above the town.

On June 21<sup>st</sup>, the group will be transported to Mulhouse, France, for a journey on a High Speed train down through the Rhone River Valley to Avignon in Southern France. Multiple days will be spent around Avignon. We will be staying within the old medieval walled town in Avignon offering the opportunity to stroll the narrow cobblestone village, shop the quaint shops, flea market and bars and restaurants in the shadow of the Palace of the Popes.

A tour of this well known city is planned, a visit of the Palais des Papes (Palace of the Popes), where several popes and antipopes lived from the early 14th to early 15th centuries, a visit to Pont d'Avignon and Notre Dame des Domes. It is followed by Bus Excursions to the Pont du Gard (built around the year 19 BC. Designed to carry the water across the small Gardon river valley; it was part of a nearly 31 miles aqueduct bringing water from Uzès to Nimes. It was constructed entirely without mortar. The Pont du Gard was added to the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites in 1985), the city of Nimes with the elliptical Roman Amphitheatre, the towns of Arles, Aix-en-Provence and L'Isle-sur-la-Sorgue (a town surrounded by water with 6 of the original 70 watermills still in place).

On June 25<sup>th</sup>, a tour bus will take the group into the French Alps, passing through Grenoble and Albertville into Chamonix, situated near the massive peaks of the Aiguilles Rouges. The town shares both the summit of highest mountain in the Alps, Mont Blanc, and the title of highest town of France.

We will take the cable Car to Aiguille du Midi at about 9,759 feet, visiting a panoramic viewing platform, with a cafe and a gift shop.

From there the bus will take the group back to Zurich for one day, to fly back to the US on June 28<sup>th</sup>.

This is a wonderful, relaxing and exciting way to see many sights in Europe in a short time period. A tour that will provide lasting memories for years to come!

The Jasper Deutscher Verein is offering a scholarship in the amount of \$1,000 to a German student of Dubois County. If you have a child, grandchild or know of anyone who would like to submit an application, please inform them to contact their Guidance Counselor at their school. Applications must be postmarked no later than April 1, 2010. If any questions, please contact Linda Wehr at 482-4432.

At their January Board of Directors' Meeting in 2008, the following adopted the following qualifications for the Dubois County Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00.

1. Completion of the common scholarship application available from the School's Guidance Office.

2. Successful completion of two years of high school German.

3. Two years of active participation in German Club or German Civic affairs in other schools.

4. Verification of enrollment in a German course at the college of their choice, or participation in an accredited German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program.

5. Submission of a one page or less essay stating your personal qualifications and intentions.

6. GPA consideration.

7. Participation in an exchange program or hosting an exchange student.

8. Submission of two letters of recommendation from adults <u>other than</u> school personnel regarding personal character, etc.

9. The scholarship will be awarded upon verification of enrollment in German at college or acceptance into another German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program. A \$500.00 scholarship will be given for the first semester and will be renewable for the second semester.

10. Parental membership in the Jasper Deutscher Verein will be considered.

## **Milestones of the Deutscher Verein**

## 1980

Founded in January, 1980, in Jasper, Indiana, USA, for the purpose of promoting interest in the community of our German heritage, history of the community, Bavarian architecture, etc. This is to be a purely social club.

First official event, The Faschnacht, at the Jasper Holiday Inn on February 9, 1980.

The first meeting of the Board of Directors and officers of the Deutscher Verein was February 21, 1980 at the Schnitzelbank.

President – Dan Wehr, Vice President – Gary Egler, Secretary – Jeanne Holler, Treasurer – Ron Kieffner Directors - Larry Hanselman, Harvey Berger, and Dave Buehler

Mrs. Sabine Jordan arrived in Dubois County to conduct a one-year study of the German-American heritage in the county. Her study, funded by grants from the Indiana Committee for the Humanities and the German American Bank Foundation, was pioneered by Stephen Harroff, a specialist in German-Americans in Indiana who spent three weeks in 1978 studying the feasibility of the larger study of the county's heritage. The Jasper Community Arts Commission and the Friends of the Arts are administering the study.

#### 1981

Officers and Board of Directors of the Deutscher Verein are Dan Wehr, Gary Egler, Jeanne Holler, Ron Kieffner, Larry Hanselman, Harvey Berger, Dave Buehler, and Jan Hulsman.

39 individuals departed Jasper on June 21<sup>st</sup> and visited Germany, Austria, and Switzerland.

Sabine Jordon's job as "Humanist in Residence" ends in June of 1981.

The Deutscher Verein made a contribution to Kim Hulsman and Clare Wagner who will study in Germany. The Deutscher Verein also donated books on German heritage to the Jasper Public Library.

In October, the Jasper Kinderlein performed for the Deutscher Verein. This group consisted of children from the five schools in the Greater jasper Consolidated School System who sang and danced in their native German costumes.

#### 1982

Officers and Board of Directors of the Deutscher Verein are Gary Egler, Ron Kieffner, Nancy Burton, Jan Hulsman, Jim Corn, Don Rasche, Mary Jane Roeder, and Dan Wehr.

The Deutscher Verein provided financial support for four Jasper High School students who studied in Germany for six weeks.

In November of 1982, Mary Jo Meuser, German Language Teacher at Jasper High School, presented information to the Deutscher Verein on a four week German exchange program. The German students would arrive here in April of 1982 and the Jasper students would go to Germany in June of 1984.

The Deutscher Verein purchased a tape "Jasper's German Heritage" and donated it to the Jasper Public Library.

#### 1983

Officers and Board of Directors of the Deutscher Verein are Ron Kieffner, Jim Corn, Nancy Burton, Jan Hulsman, Dan Wehr, Dr. George Meunich, Claude Eckert, and Gary Egler.

The Jasper Action Team is in search of a Sister City in the Baden area.

Ruth Reichmann of Sister Cities International gave a presentation to the club on the potential of a Sister City for Jasper.

The Deutscher Verein has their first German Food Stand during the Strassenfest.

#### 1984

Officers and Board of Directors of the Deutscher Verein are Ron Kieffner, Al Astrike, Rita Corn, Nancy Burton, Claude Eckert, Jan Hulsman, Dr. George Meunich, and Dennis Fritz.

Plans for a club trip to Germany and Austria are in full swing.

Two Sister Cities are being considered – Pfaffenweiler, Germany and Lofer, Austria. A final decision will be made after the upcoming trip.

In November, Pfaffenweiler, Germany was chosen to be the Sister City of Jasper. Claude Eckert consented to chair the program. A group from Pfaffenweiler will visit Jasper in April.


