# JASPER DEUTSCHER VEREIN EARLY HISTORY

The idea for a club came from Jasper Action Team, following the first Strassenfest, a club to keep the German Theme alive all year long.

Dave Buehler called the first meeting to pursue interest, and we met several times in the fall of 1979. Meetings were held at Beck's Tavern, later BeBops.

- 3. First club trip was to Terre Haute to attend their 1980 Fest
- 4. First overseas trip to Germany, Austria, Switzerland was 1981, followed by another the next year.

# Milestones of the Jasper DeutscherVerein

#### 1980

Founded in January, 1980, in Jasper, Indiana, USA, for the purpose of promoting interest in the community of our German heritage, history of the community, Bavarian architecture, etc. This is to be a purely social club.

First official event, The Fastnacht, at the Jasper Holiday Inn on February 9, 1980. Proceeds of \$1,400 from this event were donated to the Strassenfest Committee to be used for German decorations for the downtown area.

The first meeting of the Board of Directors and officers of the DeutscherVerein was February 21, 1980 at the Schnitzelbank.

Four couples went to Terre Haute to attend their Strassenfest.

Mrs. Sabine Jordan arrived in Dubois County to conduct a one-year study of the German-American heritage in the county. Her study, funded by grants from the Indiana Committee for the Humanities and the German American Bank Foundation, was pioneered by Stephen Harroff, a specialist in German-Americans in Indiana who spent three weeks in 1978 studying the feasibility of the larger study of the county's heritage. The Jasper Community Arts Commission and the Friends of the Arts are administering the study.

# 1981

39 individuals departed Jasper on June 21st and visited Germany, Austria, and Switzerland.

Sabine Jordon's job as "Humanist in Residence" ends in June of 1981.

The DeutscherVerein made a contribution to Kim Hulsman and Clare Wagner who will study in Germany.

The DeutscherVerein also donated books on German heritage to the Jasper Public Library.

In October, the Jasper DeutscherVerein charted a bus to the Octoberfest in Terre Haute.

In October, the Jasper Kinderlein performed for the DeutscherVerein. This group consisted of children from the five schools in the Greater Jasper Consolidated School System who sang and danced in their native German costumes.

# 1982

The DeutscherVerein provided financial support for four Jasper High School students who studied in Germany for six weeks.

In November of 1982, Mary Jo Meuser, German Language Teacher at Jasper High School, presented information to the DeutscherVerein on a four week German exchange program. The German students would arrive here in April of 1984 and the Jasper students would go to Germany in June of 1984.

The DeutscherVerein purchased a tape "Jasper's German Heritage" and donated it to the Jasper Public Library.

#### 1983

The Jasper Action Team is in search of a Sister City in the Baden area.

Ruth Reichmann of Sister Cities International gave a presentation to the club on the potential of a Sister City for Jasper.

The DeutscherVerein has their first German Food Stand during the Strassenfest.

#### 1984

Plans for a club trip to Germany and Austria are in full swing.

Two Sister Cities are being considered – Pfaffenweiler, Germany and Lofer, Austria. A final decision will be made after the upcoming trip.

In November, Pfaffenweiler, Germany was chosen to be the Sister City of Jasper. Claude Eckert consented to chair the program. A group from Pfaffenweiler will visit Jasper in April.

#### 1985

Elaine Astrike was appointed as Newsletter Editor.

Harold Burton and Jim Corn were chosen to work on the placement of a Maypole near the Square. A \$1,000 was budgeted for this project.

\$1,000 was also budgeted to build a permanent dance floor in the Strassenfest Beer Garden.

An organizational meeting of Sister Cities of Jasper, Inc. was held on January 15th. Some of the familiar family names of the Pfaffenweiler area are: Bauman, Bauer, Berger, Birk, Brinkman, B\Daschle, Egloff, Fink, Gutgsell, Dischinger, Eckerle, Eckert, Haas, Huber, Kaiser, Klein, Kunkel, Kunkler, Lechner, Gramelspacher, Metzger, Meurer, Neumann, Schafer, Schmidt, Schneider, Schnell, Schuler, Stenftenagel, Scherle, Troxler, Wagner, Weber, Winkler, and Zeller.

A joint meeting of the Historical Society, Strassenfest Committee, Sister Cities of Jasper, Inc., and the DeutscherVerein was held in March. Sabine Jordan spoke on the "One Thousand Year History of Pfaffenweiler".

Forty-one guests from Pfaffenweiler visited Jasper in May and the Sister City Proclamation was signed. Guests from Germany included Gerhard Auer, Hermann and Waltraude Baumann, Rita and Calba Edy Bledau, Martha Boesch, Peter Boesch, Rudolph Boesch, Walter Boesch, Rolf W. Brednich, Stefan and Theresia Eckerle, Louisa Eichhorn, Herman Elmlinger, Robert Fehrenbach, Fritz and Brigitte Gutgsell, Kurt and Irma Hanser, Heinrich Haury, Henry Heddick, Gustav and Luise Kiefer, Stephan and Agath Kiefer, Manfred Lais, Johann and Marianne Luhr, Arnald Pfaff, Paul Schuble, Eberhard and Irmagard Schuler, Joseph and Hilda Schweizer, Roswitha Seelin, Herman Seelinger, Annaliese Steinhart, Axel Steinhart, Hugo Steinhart, and Anneliese Vogel.

Dedication of the Maypole took place on October 10, 1985. Special guest was Lt. Gov. John Mutz.

## 1986

Conversational German classes continue.

Three students from Pfaffenweiler arrived for three weeks in Jasper.

Six students from Jasper High School students traveled to Pfaffenweiler during the summer.

The Volkstanzgruppe Marienfeld, a German fold dance troupe, visited Jasper and performed during the Strassenfest. Members of the DeutscherVerein hosted the dancers in their homes.

This is the first year Apple Strudel was sold in the Food Stand during Strassenfest.

Jutta Eisenring of Staufen attended classes at Jasper High School and was hosted by Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Hayden.

A new event at this year's Strassenfest is a Polka Contest.

Stones from Pfaffenweiler are on display at the Jasper Public Library.

Discussions took place on erecting signs at various city limits signifying the Sister City Partnership with Pfaffenweiler.

The DeutscherVerein subsidized a convocation for the Jasper High School and the Jasper Middle School.

#### 1987

Students from Staufen Gymnasium attended Jasper High School and visited areas of interest.

Jasper High School students attended school in Staufen and visited areas of interest in Germany.

Indiana's Gov. Robert Orr visited Pfaffenweiler.

The DeutscherVerein subsidized a convocation at Jasper High School and the Jasper Middle School.

City of Jasper adopted a city flag. A Jasper City Flag was sent to Pfaffenweiler.

The German Club of Jasper High School is selling a book of German proverbs, prayers, etc.

Food stand got a "face lift".

Lights for the murals on the east side of the Gamble building were completed in time for the Strassenfest.

The DeutscherVerein also financed a portion of the bronze plaques which identified the four panel murals on the Gamble building.

Pfaffenweiler's brass band, Batzenberger Winzerkapelle, visited Jasper and performed during the Strassenfest. Sixty-five people from Germany made the trip to Jasper. The guests from Pfaffenweiler were the special guests at the Strassenfest.

The Log Sawing Contest was introduced at the Strassenfest. Joe Eckerle was chairman.

German American Day was celebrated on October 6<sup>th</sup> at the Good Samaritan Nursing Home. Mayor Jerome Alles signed the Proclamation.

# 1988

The DeutscherVerein held an "Authentic Old Fashion Day of Butchering" on the Leonard and Viola Wehr Farm.

Members of the DeutscherVerein and Sister City of Jasper visited Pfaffenweiler and other areas of Germany.

Ambassador to West Germany visited Jasper.

The food stand at the Strassenfest was located between Gamble's and Corbin's.

#### 1989

DeutscherVerein club dues are raised. Effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, family membership is \$10 and single membership is \$5.

A curio cabinet was placed in the Schnitzelbank to display items of the DeutscherVerein

Clemens Hüppe of Pfaffenweiler spent time in Jasper working at Kimball Electronics and is staying with Al and Rosina Schuler.

Claude Eckert received the Maurice Endwright Award from the Indiana Federation of Older Hoosiers for his work in establishing and maintaining Jasper and Pfaffenweiler as Sister Cities.

Students from Staufen Gymnasium attended classes at Jasper High School and visited areas of interest.

Jasper High School students attended school in Staufen and traveled throughout Germany.

New stand for Strassenfest constructed. Committee members were Joe and Irene Eckerle, Leo and Lora Lou Eckerle, Leonard and Dennis Wehr, Bob Fleck, Jerry Jahn, Joe Niehaus, and Dave Prechtel.

Polka Masses introduced at Precious Blood, Holy Family, and St. Joseph's Church.

Year-end financial balance was \$11,344.33.

# 1990

100 cases of wine arrived from Pfaffenweiler and were sold at the Buehler Food Stores and the Schnitzelbank.

The DeutscherVerein took a trip to the Bavarian Festival in Frankenmuth, MI.

Letterhead had to be changed to comply with the postal request to change the zip code to 47547-0015.

There are approximately 270 members in the DeutscherVerein.

The weathervane, a gift from Pfaffenweiler, was installed on top of the "Old House" across from the public library.

The DeutscherVerein participated in parades at Ferdinand, Schnellville, and the Strassenfest.

Dr. and Mrs. Klaus Schraymeyer – German General Council were Hofmarschalls of the Strassenfest.

Year-end balance of the DeutscherVerein was \$16.674.99.

#### 1991

Faschnacht III dance will be held on February 9<sup>th</sup> at the Heritage Inn.

Mary Jo Meuser, German teacher at Jasper High School, has been named German Teacher of the Year by the Indiana Association of Teachers of German and was Hofmarschall of the Strassenfest.

Club membership in September was at 464.

Buehler Foods Computer Dept. set up the membership listing and newsletter mailing labels for the DeutscherVerein. The DeutscherVerein reached the computer age!!!!

Carry out containers were introduced in the Pastry Stand at the Strassenfest and were a success.

The DeutscherVerein took a trip to Helen, GA

Mayor Jerome Alles visited Pfaffenweiler.

Two trophy cases were installed at the Schnitzelbank Restaurant to display items of the DeutscherVerein.

#### 1992

Annual dance was held on February 29<sup>th</sup> at the Bavarian Inn Convention Center.

Vic Knies attended the annual Indiana State Sister Cities meeting in Fort Wayne.

The DeutscherVerein and the Sister Cities organizations – At the March, 1992 meeting a motion was made and passed that the two organizations should be combined into one for the dues and activities effective January 1, 1993. They will remain separate as far as reporting to the proper authorities since one is non-profit and the other is tax exempt. Changes in the DeutscherVerein by-laws will be made at a later meeting.

The DeutscherVerein took a trip to Kitchener in Ontario, Canada.

Black Forest Cake was introduced as a third dessert option at the Strassenfest.

The DeutscherVerein booth will be at 7<sup>th</sup> and Main Street for the Strassenfest.

# 1993

A budget process was established for the finances of the DeutscherVerein.

Vic Knies attended the annual Indiana State Sister Cities meeting in Bloomington.

Jasper High School students attended school in Staufen and traveled throughout Germany.

Students from Staufen Gymnasium attended Jasper High School and visited areas of interest.

Heiko Muehr, a student from IU working on his Master's Degree, gave a presentation on the history of immigration in the US, culminating with Fr. Kundek's efforts to supply the German-speaking immigrants in southwestern Indiana with priests who were able to speak and minister to them in their native language.

The DeutscherVerein supported the Celestine Sesquicentennial by hosting visitors from Wagshurst, Germany, took shifts at food stands, and participated in Celestine's parade.

The DeutscherVerein took a trip to the German Fest in Milwaukee, WI.

A large tent was rented to cover areas of the beer garden and family area for the Strassenfest and also a dance floor in the beer garden.

#### 1994

Partnership was established between Jasper High School and Am Weissen Turm Gymnasium in Poessneck in June.

Bob Steffe and his associate, Ron Keusch, provided entertainment for a meeting featuring Ed Meyer's German Yarns-Lofty and Concise.

The DeutscherVerein took a trip to Herman, MO.

A costumed German Mascot was purchased for use at the Strassenfest. Fritz was well received at the Strassenfest.

A Monument was erected in front of the new city office building in Jasper commemorating the Sister Cities relationship of Pfaffenweiler and Jasper.

DeutscherVerein vest patches are now available.

The Pfaffenweiler Accordion Club, The Pfaffenweiler Traditional Costume Dance Group, and the Budweiser Clydesdales team from New Hampshire were Hofmarschalls of the Strassenfest.

Year-end balance of DeutscherVerein - \$10,414.98

#### 1995

Vic Knies and Claude and Martina Eckert attended the Sister Cities International Convention in Indianapolis.

One of the meeting programs of the year was given by Gib Treadway on "Why Germans Are Democrats".

Jasper High School students attended school in Staufen and traveled throughout Germany.

35 people signed up to visit Pfaffenweiler to celebrate the 10<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Sister City Partnership. Mayor Fritz Gutgsell of Pfaffenweiler had personally invited members of the DeutscherVerein to travel to Pfaffenweiler for the celebration.

#### 1996

DeutscherVerein will sponsor the Sheephead Tourney at the Strassenfest.

Alexandra Eckerle arrived from Pfaffenweiler and began an 18 month work program at Stens. Her host family was Joe and Irene Eckerle.

Hats were sold for \$10 and suspenders for \$25.

Jim Corn is maintaining the lawn and flower area around the May Pole at 6<sup>th</sup> and Newton Streets.

The DeutscherVerein visited the Alpine German Fest in Clarksville and other attractions in Nashville, Bowling Green, Lynchburg, and Bell Buckle.

#### 1997

Matthias Hilger celebrated his 10th anniversary in Jasper.

Matthias Hilger wrote bi-weekly articles for "The Herald" about news events, historical stories, and cultural differences and similarities between Jasper and Pfaffenweiler

The Jasper Partnership Commission was established by Mayor William Schmitt.

# 1998

The monthly Stammtisch on the last Tuesday of the month at the Schnitzelbank began.

Dawn N. Weidenbenner, a student at Jasper High School, was the recipient of the Jasper DeutscherVerein Scholarship.

Claude and Martina Eckert and Joe and Irene Eckerle found host families for the visitors coming from Pfaffenweiler and surrounding communities.

Forty seven visitors from Pfaffenweiler and adjoining communities arrived in August to celebrate the Strassenfest. There are two groups, the Pfaffenweiler Alpine Horn Blowers and the Traditional Stone Carver Group.

No fall trip was taken.

JHS State Baseball Champs, Snail Valley Alpine Horn Players, and Sister City Group from Pfaffenweiler were special guests at the Strassenfest.

There was a meeting between the Jasper Partnership Commission and visitors from Pfaffenweiler and Mayor William Schmitt and Bürgermeister Fritz Gutgsell. This was the first time in the 13 year history of the Sister City Partnership that this kind of meeting took place.

# 1999

Renee Hopf, a student at Jasper High School, and Duane Meyer, a student at Forest Park Jr Sr High School, were the recipients of the Jasper DeutscherVerein Scholarships.

1999 Hofmarschalls of the Strassenfest Parade were Claude and Martina Eckert. Special guests at the Strassenfest were JHS Back-to Back National Champion Cheerleaders, Wassenberg Dance Group from Vincennes Sister City, and Wagshurst Band from Celestine's Sister City.

Mary Jo Meuser was the first recipient of the German Heritage Award presented at the German American Day Dinner held in October. Father John Boeglin was guest speaker. Sister Cities of Jasper and the Jasper Partnership Commission created the award and the Jasper DeutscherVerein sponsored the award.

The DeutscherVerein's fall trip was to the Oktoberfest in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

Plans began on the 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Sister City Partnership trip to Pfaffenweiler in June, 2000. Several projects are under taken. An anniversary quilt to be quilted by local persons will be presented to the Community of Pfaffenweiler. An anniversary booklet, a VHS greeting tape, and framed quilt blocks for the host families will be put together.

Darren Patterson was the editor of Die Zeitung.

# 2000

The movie 'Banished into Paradise' was donated to the Jasper Middle School, Jasper High School, VUJC, Jasper Library, and City Hall. This movie is the story about the immigration of Germans to America. Matthias Hilger, Raymie Eckerle, and Terry Gobert worked on this project.

Many grants were written to and received from the Indiana Humanities Council in support of activities pertaining to the 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of the Sister City Partnership with Pfaffenweiler.

Abby Potter, a student at Forest Park Jr Sr High School, was the recipient of the Jasper DeutscherVerein Scholarship.

Dave Buehler was Hofmarschall of the Strassenfest. Special guests of the Strassenfest were Ruth and Eberhard Reichmann – Sister City Organizers/Supporters.

Darren Patterson attended a Sister Cities of Indiana meeting in Indianapolis to report on all of the activities that Sister Cities of Jasper participated in in conjunction with the 15<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Jasper-Pfaffenweiler Partnership.

The first meeting of the "Kaffee Klatsch" was held at the Schnitzelbank.

The purpose of the endowment is to provide support to charitable projects benefiting generations in ensuring that our German Heritage is preserved and enriched in Jasper and Dubois County.

Leann Schwartz, a student from Forest Park Jr. Sr. High School, and Zach Pfister, a student at Jasper High School, were the recipients of the Jasper DeutscherVerein Scholarships.

Roasted Nuts were introduced at the Strassenfest.

Students from Staufen Gymnasium attended Jasper High School and visited areas of interest.

Linus and Sally Lechner were awarded the German Heritage Award at the German American Day Dinner in October. Judge Hugo Songer was the guest speaker.



At their January Board of Directors' Meeting in 2008, the following adopted the following qualifications for the Dubois County Scholarship in the amount of \$1,000.00.

- 1. Completion of the common scholarship application available from the School's Guidance Office.
- 2. Successful completion of two years of high school German.
- 3. Two years of active participation in German Club or German Civic affairs in other schools.
- 4. Verification of enrollment in a German course at the college of their choice, or participation in an accredited German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program.
- 5. Submission of a one page or less essay stating your personal qualifications and intentions.
- 6. GPA consideration.
- 7. Participation in an exchange program or hosting an exchange student.
- 8. Submission of two letters of recommendation from adults <u>other than</u> school personnel regarding personal character, etc.
- 9. The scholarship will be awarded upon verification of enrollment in German at college or acceptance into another German study abroad program such as the IU Honors Program. A \$500.00 scholarship will be given for the first semester and will be renewable for the second semester.
