LOG SAWING CONTEST

The Deutscher Verein is sponsoring this long time event of the Strassenfest. The event is held on the Main Stage on Thursday evening at 9:00 p.m.

Werner Sawmill, Inc. is again our financial sponsor. They pay for prizes and supply wood products used in the contest; there is no club expense.

No entry fee is charged, but prizes are awarded in both the men's and women's category. Beautiful custom designed mugs for both 1st and 2nd place winners.

The event has been held continuously since the mid 1980's and has quite a following. The crowd is usually 300-400 or more, and has 30-40 people competing. Teams simply sign up before the event. Each two person team tries to saw through a log before the other team on the other end of the log.

Erdbeer Bowle Recipe

Erdbeer Bowle is the perfect drink for a warm day... serve it for brunch, at Bar B Que parties, or on a warm evening in the yard.

Prep Time: 1 hour, 30 minutes
Total Time: 2 hours
Category: Beverage
Yield: Large Pitcher or Punch Bowl

Ingredients
1 pound RIPE Strawberries
1/3 to 1/2 cup of Orange Liqueur
2 Bottle (750ml) Riesling Wine
1 Bottle dry Sparkling Wine (Champagne or Prosecco)

Instructions

Make sure the Riesling and Sparkling wine are chilling....
If you want to decorate the glasses... set aside a few of the prettiest berries.

Cut off the leaves, and slice the strawberries.
Put them in a bowl with the Orange Liqueur, and let them macerate/soak for 30 minutes to 1 hour. (Longer is ok too...)

(I serve from a big pitcher, but if you have a nice punch bowl in your Schrank, now is a great time to pull it out.) Put the Strawberries and all of the juice from the bowl into your serving Pitcher.

> Add the Riesling and Sparkling Wine. Chill for an hour (unless you are in a hurry) Serve...

Make sure everyone gets some of the boozy berries....
Garnish the glasses with the pretty berries that you set aside (just cut a small wedge up the bottom of the berry, and it will slide easily onto the rim)... or maybe a sprig of mint or strip of orange peel.

Best Black Forest Cupcake Recipe

Total Time: 2 hours

Yield: 24

Ingredients

CUPCAKE BATTER:

3 oz. Unsweetened Chocolate 3/4 cup Butter

2 cup Flour

1 3/4 cup Sugar

3 TBL Unsweetened Cocoa Powder

1 1/4 tsp. Baking Soda 1/2 cup Buttermilk**

2 Eggs

2 tsp. Vanilla

1 cup Boiling Water

FILLING:

1 can Cherry Pie Filling

WHIPPED CREAM TOPPING

2 cups Heavy Cream
4 Tbl Superfine or granulated Sugar
Bar of Chocolate for Shaving
optionalKirschwasser (Cherry Liquor)

Instructions

Preheat Oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit Line 24 cupcake cups with paper liners Cupcakes:

Set some water on to boil (you'll need a cup of boiling water)

Melt the Unsweetened Chocolate and butter together.

Set aside to cool a bit.

In the bowl of a stand mixer, combine the flour, sugar, cocoa powder and baking soda. Mix it up a bit.

Turn on the mixer, and pour in the chocolate/butter

mixture... mix to combine.

The mixture will look thick at this point, don't worry, we'll loosen things up.

Add the buttermilk, eggs and vanilla.... mix until

note if you don't have buttermilk, and don't feel like buying buttermilk, you can make this quick substitutionadd 1 tsp of lemon juice to 1 cup of milk, let it sit 5 minutes, use as buttermilk (yes, it looks kind of yucky, but the taste is right for baking).

Slowly add the boiling water... SLOWLY, or you'll be wearing it (you do have an apron on, right?).

Run mixer on medium until everything is all mixed up and smooth-ish.

Scoop the batter into the prepared cupcake liners. I use an ice cream scoop with a thumb release for this (keeps

it neat), but you can use a spoon, ladle or pitcher... up to you. You want to fill them 2/3 full.

Bake 20 minutes.

Let cool on a rack.... Don't even THINK about trying to fill and frost these cupcakes until they cool.. what a mess. They cool? Did you touch them? On the bottom too? (**If You want to sprinkle the cakes with Kirschwasser... now is the time**)

Filling: Now for the filling... open the can... I like to pour the contents into a bowl, so I can pretend that I made it myself.

Assembly: Using a spoon or a scoop (I have a concave coffee scoop that is perfect for this job).... scoop the top out of the cupcake, fill the cavity with some cherry filling, and drop the bit back on top. Now.. it might be a good idea to cut the bottom off of the scooped bit so that it fits better- plus you can eat the cut off bits(keeps the counter neater).

Now for the Frosting: It is traditional to cover a Black Forest Cake with Whipped Cream, so, Whip up the Cream along with the sugar until you get stiff peaks.

Don't over whip and make butter.

Pipe or spread on the whipped cream leaving a little hole or dent in the center.

Spoon a cherry into the dent.

Chocolate Shavings- Take a chocolate bar and a vegetable peeler.... peel the edge of a chocolate bar like it was a carrot. Done. NOTE- do this over a plate, then sprinkle onto the cupcakes, this gives you more control over the look. HOWEVER- handling the chocolate curls with your fingers could cause them to melt. You decide what you want to do.
